A Message from Fr Derek Humphrey - Beloved in Christ, November is the month of Holy Souls - those who have died to this world and are now completing their growth into wholeness (holiness) and we give thanks for the life, prayers and love of those who have completed this process. That great cloud of witnesses urging us on to join them (Hebrews 12:1). Later in the month we shall put prayerful arms around all who have died as a result of war or violence, The Church teaches that the departed soul is not dead, but alive and praying, safe in God's hand and heart, seeing everything in a new light, unlearning the taste for sin, learning God's goodness and beauty. Being clothed in the love of Jesus - sure to go to Heaven when ready, but greatly needing the encouragement our prayers give them. When we pray for our friends in this world, we pray for those whose vocations may be very different from our own; whose paths may

diverge widely from our own. Yet we still hold them up to God, we identify ourselves with our Lord's will for them - and that is all we can do for them. However, with our friends and loved ones departed it is rather different. With them we can identify to the fullest extend. They have gone the way we are certain also to go, and so our prayer for them is inevitably also a prayer for ourselves; because any prayer for the departed identifies us with the fellow sinner confronted with the purifying fire of the Divine Love. We know that at the font we were incorporated into Christ's death, therefore we are of one body with the departed and part of the mutuality of relationships within the Body of Christ. We know too that, as members of the one body, the Holy Spirit will make our prayers effective and enable us to recognise and benefit from the holiness of others. The Saints, the holy dead, share with Christ something of His own transcendence and universality - i.e. they belong to all times and all places. Their sins and imperfections have been purged by the love of Him on whom their hearts were set; they have become transparent to that love, i.e. they have become vessels of the Spirit towards their brothers and sisters in this world. That is why we may always legitimately turn to them, for in so doing we do not turn away from Christ, but to icons of Christ who reflect the glory of the God-man Jesus and which are filled with the power of His Sprit. For we are ALL one in Christ, loving each other as He loves us. My love and prayers to, and for, you all. Father Derek
