### A Message from Fr Derek Humphrey -

Beloved in Christ, Heaven is our homeland - here we are merely strangers and pilgrims. We pass through this world as a child passes through school, preparing for the adult life ahead. Thus the way we use, the time given to us as we pass through this world, is of very great importance. Jesus says to each one of us "You are a small cog in a big machine, but you are vital to my work. Therefore give me your mind, to fill with my thoughts. Give me your heart to fill with my love. Give me your will, that I may breathe my power into it. Give me your defects and I will cure them. Give me your faults, and I will pardon them. Give me your talents, and I will develop them. Give me your worries, and I will disperse them. Give me your sorrows, and I will sooth them. Give me your crosses, and I will teach you how to carry them. Go forward in confidence, because of your Communion, I am in you, and you are in me." Our faith begins not in the stable at Christmas, but outside the tomb on Easter day. The resurrection of Jesus is our beginning and our end. The message Jesus gives at each resurrection appearance is, "Fear not - my peace be with you." The resurrection of Jesus shows us that it is faithfulness and not success that is required. The crucifixion shows us that in this world we do not know what in the eyes of God success is, or what is failure. In eternity we may well discover that our great 'failure' was in fact our greatest triumph - it depends only on the amount of 'God-love' we put into each effort.

So then, as we begin our ministry here together in Tangmere and Oving, remember that each of us will work in our own vitally important way to spread the Kingdom of God even further and deeper into the hearts and lives of the people of our parish.

It will of course take me a while to put the right names to the right faces, so do be patient with me - and thank you all for the wonderful welcome I have already received. Although I am here for what the diocese call 'light duty', please do not hesitate to contact me at any time, on any matter, but especially in cases of sickness or hospitalisation.
